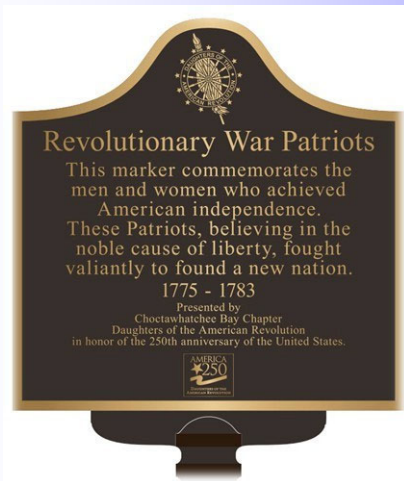


About Our Chapter
